Together with their two children, Valentina and Urick they arrived to Australia on the first refugee ship into Newcastle in August 1949 with their only possession being the clothes on their backs.

Both Michailo and Maria worked very hard to provide for their family that grew to 3 children with the birth of Anna. Close to their retirement they took over the care of 3 grandsons as well.

Michailo loved his vegetable garden, fishing and having a beer with his workmates, dancing with mum during their younger years and family barbecues where there would always be exuberant singing.

We remember Michailo would whistle away as he pottered about in contentment when building things, fixing things, or working in the garden. Whatever needed doing he was always there trying to get it done - but be warned, it was always his way or no way at all!

Michailo was a tough disciplinarian and very stubborn but he had a deep abiding love for his family.

A lopsided fence still stands at his home of 60 years in Council Street which he rebuilt as his eyesight was failing. Old age and illness was not kind to Michailo in his later years as the body would not obey the brain.


